Description: To address the recent spike in heroin related deaths in Maryland, the Office of the Attorney General has received a federal grant to fund two Assistant Attorney General positions in its Organized Crime Division. Both positions will work in coordination with local and federal investigative agencies to focus on the source of heroin and its cutting agent fentanyl involved in overdose deaths, and build prosecutions to dismantle the heroin trafficking organization(s) that supplied the heroin that will be brought in state and/or federal court. One AAG will work in the Organized Crime Unit of the Maryland Attorney General's Office which handles complex investigations and prosecutions of criminal gang activities, firearms and narcotics trafficking, and violent felonies from serious assaults to serial murders. The second position will be cross designated as a Special Assistant U.S. Attorney and will work in the Narcotics Section of the U.S. Attorney's Office in Baltimore which handles complex investigations and prosecutions of criminal gang activities, firearms and narcotics trafficking. Both positions will work regularly with the DEA Heroin Task force and related state and local task forces investigating heroin related deaths. The positions are grant funded for one year.

Experience: The ideal candidate will have at least two years of experience with complex criminal investigations and prosecutions, experience with narcotics investigation preferred. Strong abilities to build and maintain relationships with victims, witnesses, and law enforcement are essential, along with excellent legal research, writing, and oral advocacy skills. Maryland Bar membership is required.
